March 31st greets northwest IL with a blanket of wet snow and high winds. The month started like a lamb, warm though muddy. And now, the lion escorts us to April.

What a month March was. Weather was a yo-yo, with wind storms, some lows in the lower 20s, plenty of rain, endless squishy ground, and yet also gentle days with sunshine and temps in the 60s and even a day in the 70s. The world climate was scary. War in Ukraine left us all speechless, wondering how can war in Europe reemerge. Helplessly, we watched as a small country faced brutal destruction from a tyrant. All the while, we wondered how this might escalate around the world. At home we watched gas prices sour and stocks plummet. Meanwhile, COVID subsided, relatively, and mask mandates were lifted. At the same time, the flu and other wintertime illnesses infected many in our area. All this occurred as we progressed through the season of Lent.

So much of the last two years has seemed unreal. Looking back on writings I shared with the congregation two years ago, it was evident we really didn't know what we were in for. A pandemic was something so new for us. Yet in two years, we have learned that if we ever had a stable world around us, it is unlikely we can ever again look for real stability in our world. For the October 2021 newsletter article, I wrote about 'liminality', which is a 'time of transition'. I spoke about the transition of seasons, which are most evident in October and April. And I explored the time of transition in our world, and our lives. Six months later, after continual contemplation about our 'liminal times' in which we are living, I have concluded that life, simply, is continually liminal. Life is a continual journey of transition. The idea of liminality is that at a given time, we start at point A in our life, where everything is known and secure. Then we head to point B. When we get to point B, we will find a new realm of security and grounding. It is the journey from point A to point B that we are in a liminal time. Certainly, these secure times exist to a degree. For those of us who got sick in March for sure know that there was the time in which we were healthy, the time in which we were sick, and the time that we were better again. In February, we were at a time with no war in Ukraine, and now we are in a time of war that is affecting lives of people around the world, and we pray that soon the war will be over. Our liminality could be a time of being employed to being unemployed to being employed again. It might be having a romantic relationship, to being single, to being in a relationship again. There are several times in our life we go through transitions and must face liminality. When we look at single aspects of our life, we can see full cycles of change, transition and transformation. Yet when we look at the big picture, life, really, is always in transition. The seasons continually change. Our bodies continually age. Everyone keeps getting older. And the world around us keeps getting less certain. It is impossible today to say that we certainly know how the day, the week, the month or the year will play out. It is impossible to feel like we have solid ground below us. Unreal circumstances constantly lurk around the corner and jump on us whenever they desire. And I question, hasn't life actually always been

this way? Is it really that the past two years have hardened us and shown us that our comfort bubble that we have placed around us is really imaginary? Is not the time from birth to death actually a continual liminal time with moments of security?

As we move beyond the latest variant and wave of COVID, we wonder what will be next. We are learning to enjoy the breaks between and hoping to regain more of our pre -COVID life in our current moment. We know everything can change with a blink of an eye, so now, we are that much more aware that we need to embrace what we have when we have it. And though with masks mostly off, and with a quiet time between COVID variants (assuming another will come), we are still in a liminal time. We are still learning to transition in this new world. Churches are also seeking to discern who God is calling them to be in this new era of humanity. How is it that we can perform the will of God? How can we discern what the will of God actually is? And how do we transition from what we are doing to what God calls us to be doing?

In the season of Lent, we are in a liminal time. We are remembering the end of Jesus' ministry. This first week of April we will watch as Jesus makes his final journey into Jerusalem. We will witness the crowds shout hosanna and declare him as the one who saves, while we too wave our palms. We will celebrate as Jesus shares his last supper with us, and gives us the new commandment to love one another. We will cringe as Jesus is arrested and beaten. We will cry as he dies on the cross. We will rejoice as Jesus rises from the grave. We will be reassured as Jesus regroups with his disciples and hands


